The Prayer to the Holy Spirit - The Backbone of Emmaus

Scot Ocke - Community Spiritual Director

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful and kindle in them the fire of Your love. Send forth Your Spirit and they shall be created and You shall renew the face of the earth. O God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit, we may be truly wise, and ever enjoy Your consolations. Through Christ our Lord, Amen.

We pray this prayer at every team meeting in preparation for Walks, before every Emmaus talk, and should pray it at our reunion group meetings. What does it mean?

1. Prayer should be regular and constant. Prayer is our life line to God. Have you noticed that by the end of the Walk it is almost ‘automatic’ to pray this prayer? Prayer should be automatic in our daily, even hourly lives. We should automatically turn to God for everything we need.
2. It is our confession that we are very dependent on the Holy Spirit. Asking, ‘Come Holy Spirit’ is our way of saying we are incapable of this ministry and even life alone. We are desperate for Him, incapable without Him. A Walk to Emmaus without the Holy Spirit would be impossible; it could never even begin. A life without the Holy Spirit is also impossible and fruitless.
3. We are a people who desperately need loved. The fire of God’s love needs to be felt deep within us. Life is just empty without Him. We need to be constantly reminded that God loves us unconditionally and we need to be filled to overflowing with His love. When filled, we spill out and love others.
4. We need wisdom. ‘... Who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful ... grant that we may be truly wise... We need God’s revelation to make decisions in this world; we need His instruction and teaching to lead our families, to lead our churches, to make the hard decisions of a life in Christ. We need the wisdom of God’s Spirit.

The prayer to the Holy Spirit is not just for the time of our Walk, but for all of our Fourth Days. May we continue to pray, ‘Come Holy Spirit ...’

KAIROS MEANS GOD'S SPECIAL TIME

What is Kairos Torch?

Crime among youthful offenders is the most rapidly growing segment of corrections. Kairos has developed Kairos Torch to facilitate ministry to youthful offenders, ages 15 -21.

The mission of Kairos Torch on the introductory weekend is to encourage the participants to remove their masks so the real person, rather than who they pretend to be, can shine forth. We create a safe environment for them to begin to show themselves and learn what life can be like in a loving, caring and trusting community. We challenge the participants to risk being vulnerable. We love them unconditionally as demonstrated by Christ. Then, it is up to them, with the help of their mentor, to begin to break through their own walls.



The goals of Kairos Torch are:

- To provide a safe place to the youthful offender for spiritual exploration.
- To offer unconditional love and acceptance in a Christian setting.
- To encourage the sharing of life journeys and help the youthful offender find a full life.
- To foster spiritual growth and to promote participation in the long term mentoring process which provides spiritual and emotional support in order to enhance positive self-esteem and promote constructive life choices.
